Congressional Candidate Kathleen Brown Opposes Voting Decentralization in Amarillo
AMARILLO, TX—

Congressional candidate Kathleen Brown opposes the proposed resolution to decentralize voting in Amarillo. The resolution, titled “Resolution to the Potter County Commissioners Court Regarding the Use of Electronic Voting Devices, Elimination of Voting Centers and Putting the County Clerk in Charge of Elections Again,” is a push by the Potter County Republican Party to reverse the use of electronic voting devices and to end voting centers in Potter County. Voting centers are a common election practice, and expand voter access by allowing any resident registered to vote in their county to vote outside of their precinct.

The proposed resolution is the newest installment in a nationwide push by Republicans to enact more stringent voting requirements—this resolution claims to combat voter fraud, despite there being no evidence that fraud is a widespread phenomenon. Should this pass, elections in Potter County would no longer be bipartisan, ending a long-standing tradition in Potter County and the state of Texas and allowing for individual bias to affect election results.

Kathleen for Congress staunchly disagrees with this push for decentralized, partisan voting. The bipartisan approach using voting centers and electronic voting expands voter access across all demographics and communities, as well as removes human error in counting ballots. This resolution, should it pass, will restrict voter access in Potter County.
